# Sunday School in 2010

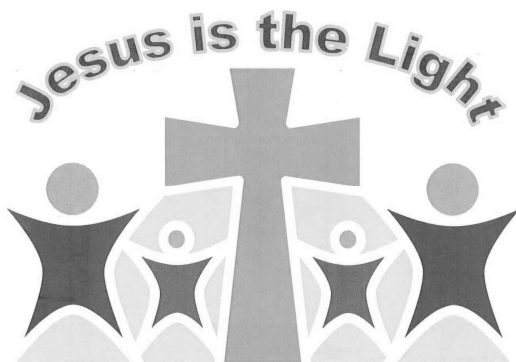
