# Worship With Us

This summer we will again maintain the two Sunday service schedule of 8:00 and 10:30. At the last Worship and Music Team meeting, the individual preference for almost everyone on the team, pastor included, was to go to one service at 9:00. After reviewing the attendance records and financial records of the past two summers, however, it was decided that we need to stay with two Sunday services and the Wednesday evening service at 6:30.

The team also decided to offer more variety of services on the schedule, so for the next three months, *for the most part*, we will worship according to the following schedule:

**Wednesday at 6:30** – a relaxed service of word and song. The preaching on Wednesday will mirror the sermon for the following Sunday. If you know you will be gone on the weekend, this is the service to check out. The Wednesday meal precedes the service and ice cream treats and fellowship follow afterward.

**Sunday at 8:00** – a return to an old LBW favorite, Setting One from *Lutheran Book of Worship*.

**Sunday at 10:30** – For the first three Sundays of the month, we will use a setting entitled, "Weaving a World Tapestry," written by members of Dakota Road. The last Sunday of the month will be more traditional with both services using Setting Three from ELW (old Setting One from LBW).

**Sunday at 9:15** – Reading from Genesis. During the summer, the preaching will focus on the big stories from Genesis, and during the education hour, we will read through the first book of the Bible. This is similar to what was done last year with Acts. You won't want to miss this. Genesis is one of the most interesting and sometimes most challenging books in the Old Testament.

## June 1 & 5

The last Sunday of the Easter season. The word for the day will come from Jesus' last sermon filled with parables on the End (beginning?) Time.

## June 8 & 12

**Pentecost Sunday** and the story of Creation from Genesis 1 and 2.

## June 15 & 19

The story of the fall into sin, Genesis 3.

## June 22 & 26

Noah and the Flood, Genesis 6 – 9.

## June 29 & July 3

Abraham's Call and Covenant, Genesis 12 & 15.

I think the highlight of the month for me will be the **Father – Kid Retreat** at Camp Onomia on Father's Day weekend, June 17-18. I don't have any kids I can bring, but I would love to adopt one if there is someone out there who needs a parent or a son for a weekend. I would encourage father's (of all ages) to come with their kids (of all ages). We have at our disposal activities for people of all ages, and at a pace I know I will enjoy – leisurely. Sign up soon on the board in the entry way to the worship space at church. There are other activities as well. We will need to be in prayer for our young adult mission trip to Tucson, AZ. We'll start planning for a super-charged Rally Day in September, and if you have some ideas for us, please share.

The constant, of course, throughout the summer is worship. Relaxed summer worship on Wednesday evenings. Lively, uplifting worship at 8:00 and 10:30 on Sunday morning. We're trying to get back to some of the Bible basics, so this summer we're focusing on Genesis. We'll be preaching on the big stories of Genesis and reading the whole book during the education hour at 9:15. I encourage you to make worship the constant in your summer weeks. It is where we get re-created. See you Sunday, if not Wednesday.

Two old men had been best friends for years, and they both live to their early 90's, when one of them suddenly falls deathly ill. His friend comes to visit him on his deathbed, and they're reminiscing about their long friendship, when the dying man's friend asks, "Listen, when you die, do me a favor. I want to know if there's baseball in heaven." The dying man said, "We've been friends for years, this I'll do for you." And then he dies. A couple days later, his surviving friend is sleeping when he hears his friend's voice. The voice says, "I've got some good news and some bad news. The good news is that there's baseball in heaven." "What's the bad news?" asks the man. "You're pitching on Wednesday."



After last month's fury over the supposed rapture I thought I might share with you God's goodness. A few Lutheran pastors took the opportunity on May 22<sup>nd</sup>, the day after Family Radio predicted Jesus' return, to preach on the greatness and goodness of God, that God is so far superior to us and so much more than we, Harold Camping included, will we ever know. We have no idea what God has planned and the Bible tells us this. However, it is still our shortcoming as human beings to try to figure God out. When we do this we fall into a pit, a spiritual pit. In all of the hype of the rapture and being left behind, we find ourselves in fear. Not that we're afraid of being left behind, but that we are already caught up in a delusion. If we knew for certain that these many who prepared to be raptured were wrong, how certain can we be that we are right? After all of this we are reminded that we are guilty of projecting our own expectations and desires upon God and that we are also capable of being over confident in our interpretations of the Bible. We find ourselves expecting God to judge the way we think He should judge and be who we think He should be. I never thought of saying this in my article but we have to admit there is a chance that we might be absolutely, devastatingly, irrecoverably wrong.

What is different, however, is that we still walk in faith. We can use opportunities like these to re-devote ourselves to God, to remember that God is good all the time and all the time God is good. We aren't always sure what 'good' looks like, but we have faith that God is in control, that we are free from our worries to love God and love one another and be certain that nothing is certain aside from God's abundant love for the world. That is enough to live on.

## Heavy Backpacks

Ted Waldo shared a story with me about the backpack program and how he was arriving at Churchill school to pick up empty backpacks so they could be filled here at church. He told me that a few of the backpacks were wearing out on the bottom. I thought this was an odd place to be wearing out. Normally you would think a zipper, or a strap would wear out first, but then as Ted told the story it hit me. The backpacks have been loaded with so much food the children have been unable to carry them so they drag them on the ground!

What a difference this program is making. Each week we fill 18 backpacks for 40 children with food provided by Channel One and we deliver the backpacks to Churchill school for the weekend. The volunteers that have helped to transport the food and the backpacks have heard nothing but praise over this program. The amazing thing is that Churchill is not the only school to benefit from this program. In fact, I believe all elementary schools in Rochester are benefiting from the backpack program in some way or another by a church or another charitable group. What is even more amazing is that the churches are only paying for the backpacks. Channel One is able to provide all of the food.

## Mission: Arizona

On Sunday June 19<sup>th</sup>, Alecia Meline, Anna Hermann, Genise Troutman, Richard and Amber Hinds, and myself will embark on a week of service and learning in southern Arizona. Our goal is to better understand the last words of Jesus before he was taken into heaven, "You will be my witness in Jerusalem, throughout all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." We recognize there are many boundaries and borders in our lives, physical, spiritual, emotional. This journey we are embarking on is meant to help us see better see these boundaries and to ask what our faith can do about them. One of the major boundaries that we as Americans face is the physical wall built between the United States and Mexico. People are attempting to flee Mexico into our country. Many don't make it. Others who do are unable to survive. What can we, as a church, do? For those that do survive and can barely make it through the day, what can we, as a church, do?

Our group will be working with a few local organizations in Tucson and Nogales in Arizona to see just how help is being given to work through the spiritual and emotional boundaries. One of the organizations fights for the survival of immigrants. They build and maintain water stations in the desert. Plans are still being made each day to try to find ways to be involved and we would love to share all of this upon our return.

Our return is also very important to this trip because while our situation here in Rochester may not be exactly the situation in Tucson or in Nogales, the same principles can be employed to help people and organizations here. If we have certain beneficial resources to serve our community, we should use them. Rochester is our Jerusalem, our Judea, and our Samaria. What can we do here that we will do at the ends of the earth? God willing, we will find out.

## 5K Run, Walk and Roll Event

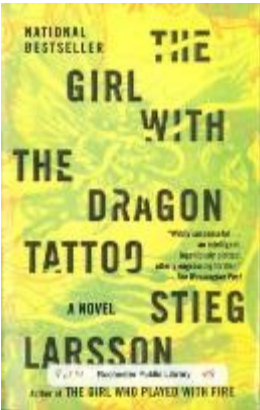

# Happy Father's Day !!!



## Just a Moment

Many of us are becoming more health conscious, working towards a healthier lifestyle. For some, this may include a change to

vegetarian diet. We often think of this as a diet rich in fruits and vegetables, excluding meat, poultry and fish. There are actually several options and understanding how to get your full nutrition needs met may be challenging. A food pyramid is available for vegetarian diets which can be very helpful.

The more restrictive the diet is, the more challenging it is to get all the elements of good nutrition into every day's meals. You may need to supplement your food intake with essential nutrients.

For example, limiting or eliminating dairy products may limit your sources of vitamin B 12 and calcium. Iron, found in meat, is critical for making healthy red blood cells. Good sources of iron include dried beans, peas, lentils, iron-enriched cereals, whole grain products and dark, leafy vegetables. Plant sources of iron are not as readily absorbed, so vegetarians also need to increase the amount of these foods eaten.

Other important nutrients which may need to be supplemented include Omega 3 fatty acids (fish and eggs), protein and iodine (animal products), vitamin D (dairy and sunshine) and zinc (animal products).

When considering changes in your diet, check with your health care provider to be sure these will be healthy for you. They may want to check vitamin levels or other blood tests to be sure these changes are healthy for you.

When you know someone will listen to the words that you say.

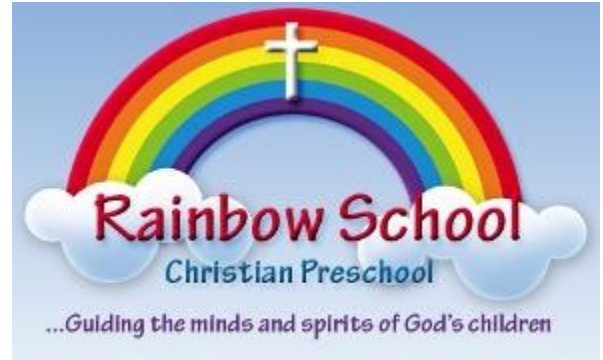
So with God's special guidance, with prayer and with time

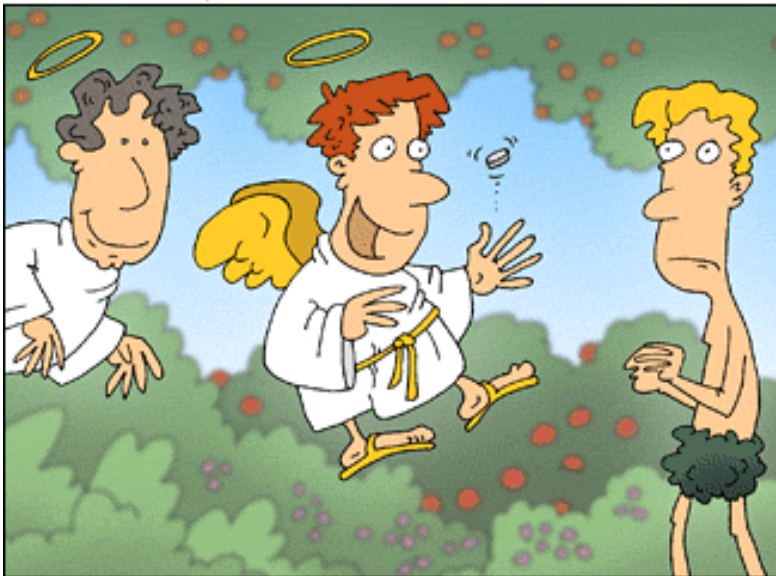
