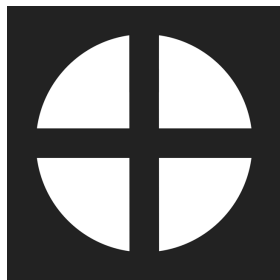

At the plate Levi flew out to first base, struck out, and grounded out to the shortstop. While he did not reach base he did advance the runners when he hit the ball.

Christian Leckband played second base and right field and did have a short fly hit to him which he brought into the infield. At the plate Christian struck out twice and walked once. In the fourth inning Christian was able to advance around the bases and score a run.

Alex Douglas played third base which is commonly referred to as the "hot" corner and it lived up to that title. He had several ground balls hit to him and he did a great job of fielding the ball. Alex had three trips to the plate getting two singles and a walk. He was forced out on a fielders choice while advancing to third base, was left stranded on third base, and scored a run in the final inning.
