# Worship With Us

## Summer Worship Plans

**Worship times will not change for the summer.** We will continue to have two services at 8:00 and 10:30. We will, however, have a Wednesday evening worship service like past years.

The 8:00 service will be retro, using an old friend, Setting 4 from *Evangelical Lutheran Worship* (Setting 2 from the old *Lutheran Book of Worship*).

The 10:30 service will use Setting 6, a jazzier setting used a couple summers ago.

The 6:30 Wednesday informal worship will be preceded by a light dinner at 5:30.

Our intern, Cara, is preparing a **dynamite Bible study** using the Book of Acts to think about what the church will look like as we move into the 21<sup>st</sup> Century. She will meet with interested adults and youth in between worship services at 9:15.

**Summer Sunday VBS is coming.** For the Sundays of June 20 and July (not July 4, though), we will have Vacation Bible School in between services at 9:15. Seven great stories will be read, sung, acted out, built, and watched. Children, youth, and adults of all ages will be involved together (no grades and no grading).

**All three of these offerings need your involvement:**

\*\*We are looking for musicians to help with the Sunday worship. This is a great opportunity for young people or unknown (so far) music talent to either provide an anthem or accompany in music leadership.

\*\*If anyone has an interest in the changing nature of the church, the Bible study will provide the forum for learning more. Bring your ideas and share the differences and changes you have experienced in worship.

\*\*Pastor Fred has selected his favorite three great stories for Summer VBS. He is looking for input for four more. Do you have a favorite you would like to have some fun with? The Summer VBS will be a family, intergenerational affair. All ages will be involved together. Everyone's help will be needed. Plan to come and to jump in and help. If anyone is interested in helping with the planning, contact Pastor Fred STAT.

## June 6 – The Apostles on Trial

Our summer journey through the book of Acts begins this Sunday. The stakes were high for the early Christian community, with charges pressed against them for healing in Jesus' name.

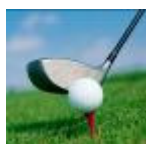
## We Did 195 Pounds

The last book of the 2009 - 2010 school season will be *The Nanny Diaries* by Nicola Kraus & Emma McLaughlin. Here's a brief synopsis:

### **Who wouldn't want this job?**

*Struggling to graduate from NYU and afford her microscopic studio apartment, Nanny takes a position caring for the only son of the wealthy X family. She rapidly learns the insane amount of juggling involved to ensure that a Park Avenue wife who doesn't work, cook, clean, or raise her own child has a smooth day. When the Xs marriage begins to disintegrate, Nanny ends up involved way beyond the bounds of human decency or good taste. Her tenure with the X family becomes a nearly impossible mission to maintain the mental health of their four-year-old, her own integrity and, most importantly, her sense of humor. Over nine tense months Mrs. X and Nanny perform the age-old dance of decorum and power as they test the limits of modern-day servitude.*

*The Nanny Diaries deftly skewers the manner in which America's over-privileged raise les petites over-privileged-as if grooming them for a Best in Show competition. Written by two former nannies, this alternately comic and poignant satire punctures the glamour of Manhattan's upper class.*

## Just a Moment

Many of us are at the age and time in our lives where we are caring for elderly relatives, often our parents. For some this might be a daily opportunity to provide care for someone, for others it might mean managing financial and business affairs for an elderly relative.

But in reality, we may have mixed feelings about this role. Some of, search and find name, sherry holst, us have raised children and are making plans for travel, retirement and leisure time. We expected to have a few less responsibilities, rather than more. In addition, some elderly relatives may not welcome the help they truly need, thus making us feel less than appreciated.

Wherever you find yourself in this scenario, you are NOT ALONE! One in three adults is providing some level of care to an elderly relative. So how do we take care of ourselves? Many of us feel uncomfortable asking for help, hiring help or taking a break. But when you are feeling overwhelmed remember, you are entitled to a life of your own, your thoughts and feelings are normal and shared by many others in the same situation, taking care of yourself is a gift you give to those you love and you can't meet every need or request.

## Rhubarb Crunch

1 c. flour  
5 T. powdered sugar  
1/2 c. butter  
2 eggs  
1 1/2 C. sugar  
1/4 c. flour  
3/4 tsp. baking powder  
salt (to taste)

2-3 c. cut up rhubarb, unsweetened  
Mix together 1 c. flour, powdered sugar and butter/ pat into an 8 or 9 inch square pan. Bake at 350 for 12-15 min. or until golden. Beat eggs until fluffy. Add sugar, 1/4 c. flour, baking powder and salt ( which has been sifted together). Add rhubarb and pour over crust. Bake at 350 for 35 min. The egg mixture comes to the top and forms a meringue.
