Our Congregation Shared and Leadership Listened, By Warren Harmon

Our congregation L<u>eadership Team</u> held two *Leadership Listens* sessions recently. On Wednesday, October 26 and Sunday, October 30, the L<u>eadership Team</u> wanted to hear from members of Our Savior's in a setting that invited the sharing of comments, ideas and questions for our lay leadership and pastors. We actively listened to comments on several issues, took notes for discussion and planning for our future.

Over the two sessions, these were some of the topics discussed:

- **Digital Online Ministry** The question of live streaming our Sunday service was raised, and we responded that the format for our online experience will change to a full recording of our 9:00 am service to be uploaded to Facebook and YouTube going forward, rather than the previous format of pre-recording the service. We began this on Sunday, October 30. Pastor Ben reported that a good number of church members and visitors are currently viewing these services and we will continue to evolve our digital presence.
- Outreach for OSLC Seniors A good discussion was held about reaching out to our senior congregation members. Ideas were shared, and our Lay Ministry Team will look at solutions for bringing many older members our online service more efficiently. We agreed that reaching out to our older members on a regular basis and bringing our services to them must continue.
- Stewardship Questions were raised about the timing of our next OSLC Stewardship program. Our leadership team explained that we held our 2022 drive in February of this year, and we held our capital campaign for the HVAC system, so we were reluctant to move forward with another appeal for our congregation. Members in our sessions suggested that we still hold a stewardship campaign in November/December of this year, so we move forward with our 2023 planning. This was a good discussion and supported by attendees. The leadership team agreed to hold a stewardship program that will launch November 13th.
- **Evangelism and Growing Membership at OSLC** Reaching out to grow the membership of our congregation was a concern shared by a number of those in attendance. We agreed that evangelism is the responsibility of every member of our congregation, and that additional encouragement and practice would be helpful. We recognized the strain that the pandemic has added to this matter, but that now is the time to refocus our efforts.

Overall, there was good, engaging discussion at both sessions. Our Leadership Team was encouraged by these sessions, and we hope to continue offering opportunities for members of Our Savior's to openly speak with our leadership quarterly each year. We will address this at a future meeting.

I personally want to encourage any member who wants to share a thought, idea, or comment to reach out to our lay leaders and pastors anytime. We will listen, and we welcome these conversations. We know, that through healthy exchanges, we can work together to strengthen all those wonderful OSLC connection points and ministries that have been developed to carry on and support Christ's love for one another.


